

The types of business to be approved

For NEIS Eligibility, a business must:

- Be new and not be operating on a commercial basis
- Be independent
- Be lawful and capable of withstanding public scrutiny
- Be Commercially Viable
- Not compete with an existing business unless you can show that there is an unsatisfied demand
- Be established, located and operated solely within Australia
- Have controlling interest for the duration of the NEIS Participant Agreement
- Be a Commercial Entity
- Have the skills, abilities and resources to start your business

To be eligible for NEIS you must:

- be at least 18 years of age at the time of commencing in NEIS Assistance
- not prohibited by law from working in Australia
- Not be an overseas visitor on a working holiday visa or an overseas student studying in Australia
- be available to participate in NEIS Training (if relevant) and work Full Time in the proposed NEIS business
- not have received NEIS Assistance in the previous three years
- not be an undischarged bankrupt

NEIS is funded by the Australian Government (Department of Employment).

What NEIS provides

- ASQA accredited small business training so you can establish and run your own small business
- Business mentoring and support during your first year of business operation
- NEIS Allowance for up to 39 weeks and NEIS Rental Assistance for up to 26 weeks (if eligible)

Basic family and additional family payment for dependent children from Centrelink (please contact Centrelink for advice)
