

The types of business to be approved

NEIS Business Eligibility Criteria are that the proposed NEIS Business:

- Is not currently operating on a commercial basis
- Has an **independent** business structure
- Is lawful and capable of withstanding public scrutiny
- Has been assessed as **Commercially Viable**
- Will be established, located and operated solely within Australia and
- Will be structured so that the person has and will maintain a **Controlling Interest** over the NEIS Business for the duration of the person's NEIS Participant Agreement
- Have the skills, abilities and resources to start your business

To be NEIS Eligible, a person must:

- be at least 18 years old when they start NEIS Assistance
- not be prohibited by law from working in Australia
- not be an overseas visitor on a working holiday visa or an overseas student studying in Australia
- be available to participate in NEIS Training (if relevant) and work Full Time in the proposed NEIS business
- not have received NEIS Assistance in the past year
- not be an undischarged bankrupt

The **New Enterprise Incentive Scheme (NEIS)** is a program which assists unemployed people in turning a viable business idea into their own small business.

NEIS is funded by the Australian Government (Department of Jobs and Small Business).

What NEIS provides

- ASQA accredited small business training so you can establish and run your own small business
- Business mentoring and support during your first year of business operation
- NEIS Allowance for up to 39 weeks and NEIS Rental Assistance for up to 26 weeks (if eligible)

Basic family and additional family payment for dependent children from Centrelink (please contact Centrelink for advice)

*Please note that NEIS does **not** provide start-up capital for your business.*
